

Texas Abandoned Crab Trap Removal Program







Texas ACTRP

 Senate Bill 1410 - Passed during 77th Legislative session (2001)

Mandated 10-day closure period in February

Conducted annually since 2002

– ~ 12,000 voluntary hours (> 3,000 volunteers)

– > 1,000 vessels

-> 35,000 traps!

Resource Benefits

Reduces "Ghost Fishing"

- Blue crabs are dominant species followed by stone crab and sheepshead
- > 500,000 blue crab saved to date
- Over 40 different species have been freed
- Protects sensitive habitats (Seagrasses)
- Improves aesthetics
